Opening Statement

Connections for Learning is a unique school with diverse programming from k-12. Our motto is *"making programs fit kids, not kids fit programs"*. During the 2022-2023 school year, we will continue to foster each programs' pillars, goals and continue to develop the identity of each program. Additionally, we will continue to explore programming considering the needs of the stakeholders in Parkland School Division.

While recognizing that our programs are very different and unique, this past year we have had a common focus across all of our K-9 programs. In the 2021-2022 school year we have been intentionally and purposefully focussing on literacy and numeracy within our classrooms. For the 2022-2023 school year we are excited to continue our foundational work in these areas. We are confident we will see continued growth and improvement in our students and staff learning while maintaining the integrity and pillars of each program.

Contextual Information

- Literacy is an foundational skill for every student that impacts every part of their lives
- Currently, 50% of students are reading below grade level
- We recognize that students lost learning during the Covid pandemic and we need to make up for those gaps in terms of literacy and numeracy
- The Mipi data shows that greater attention to numeracy is required in grade 7-9; thus, this will be a focus of subject specialist teachers in grades 7-9
- Further developing program identity
- Further develop alternative programs to continue to meet the needs of Parkland School Division

Potential Roadblocks

- Time
- Staff resources and collaboration opportunities
- Teacher expertise and training
- Diversity in programming and students (in person/virtual/part-time attendance students)
- Physical space restrictions within current buildings

Outcomes

Our literacy and numeracy goal is for all students (K-9) to demonstrate growth in their literacy skills, reduce the total number of students performing below grade level and close the gap on those significantly below grade level.
